For 2020 Spring and Summer Semesters, course content and instruction for all Augusta Tech campuses and sites, including Adult Education and the Georgia Cyber Center, will remain online. Students are encouraged to participate in these classes, complete assignments, and engage with their instructors at prescribed online meeting times. This teaching platform will ensure that students are able to complete their courses and meet their academic requirements. We will continue to maintain online academic and student support services.

Summer Semester 2020 is scheduled June 1 through August 14, 2020. The semester courses will be delivered in an online format with lab and clinical options (if allowable by the site).

The lecture component of all classes will be delivered in an online format using the Blackboard learning environment. All students are required to complete Badge training before registering for online courses. Course schedules may include a “to be announced” (TBA) notation for lab, clinical, and lecture opportunities to be scheduled at a later date.
